THE RITE OF REDEDICATION

President Prange: It is good for us to remember our calling in life and the work God has set before us. Will the members of the Seminary faculty please rise.
Faculty, you are the teachers through whom the Lord is training the next generation of gospel heralds. I ask you, Will you faithfully instruct the youth entrusted to your care? Will you set your life as an

example before your students? With firm confidence in God's Word and with reliance on prayer, will you joyfully fulfill the high calling of your individual ministries?

Faculty: *We will for Jesus' sake, with the heavenly Father's help and by the Holy Spirit's power.*

President Prange: Will the seniors join the faculty in standing.

Seniors, you are beginning your last year at this school. You are the leaders of the student body. You will be the pastors, teachers, missionaries, and lay leaders of tomorrow's church. I ask you, Will you be faithful in your studies? Will you lead the younger students with Christ-like service? Will you give prayerful thought to the church's need for full-time servants who will preach and teach God's truth to a dying world?

Seniors: *We will for Jesus' sake, with the heavenly Father's help and by the Holy Spirit's power.*

President Prange: Will the juniors join the faculty and seniors in standing.

Juniors, you have successfully passed the midpoint of your high school years. As upperclassmen you are taking up new privileges and responsibilities. You are soon to make decisions regarding your life's work. I ask you, Will you be examples of hard work and the wise fulfillment of responsibility? Will you look to the Holy Spirit to provide guidance in choosing your life's calling?

Juniors: *We will for Jesus' sake, with the heavenly Father's help and by the Holy Spirit's power.*

President Prange: Will the sophomores join the faculty and upperclassmen in standing.

Sophomores, as you return for another year at Seminary, you know that the Lord has given you the ability to complete the course laid down by our church for the future leaders of our church. Yet there is much for you to learn. I ask you, Will you make the most of your abilities and opportunities, inside and outside of the classroom? Will you seek God's will in discovering your life's work?

Sophomores: *We will for Jesus' sake, with the heavenly Father's help and by the Holy Spirit's power.*

President Prange: Will the freshmen join the rest of the Seminary family in standing.

Freshmen, Seminary is new for you. You are concerned about making friends, about being away from home, about your grades, and about making hard choices in the way you live. Without God's help you would surely fail. I ask you, Will you trust that the Lord who brought you to our school will be with you this year and always? In giving thanks for his many blessings, will you consider how best you might use your life in service to your Savior?

Freshmen: *We will for Jesus' sake, with the heavenly Father's help and by the Holy Spirit's power.*

President Prange: Will all the remaining worshipers please stand. Mothers and fathers, relatives and friends, it is for you and your children's children that this school exists. Let us pray.

President Prange: Father in heaven, bless our school and bless all who are a part of the Seminary family. Forgive our failures and shortcomings for Jesus' sake. Send us the Holy Spirit so that your will is done in our day. Renew the strength of the faculty members who continue to preach and teach among us. Bring joy to the ministries of those new faculty members who have been installed this afternoon. Endow the leaders of our student body with sound judgment and a high degree of responsibility. Inspire every student faithfully to use the gifts you have given. Grant our new students a sense of belonging and instill in them the confidence that you are always with them. Recruit workers for the public ministry from among the young people here present. Bestow special blessings upon those who support our school with their prayers and offerings. Grant safe travel to those who serve you. All this we ask in Jesus' name. Amen.
